Facts:

On 11 August 2020, I, Det. Bret McMahan was working for the Southern Arkansas University Police Department. On this date I received a call from SAU Patrol Officer Clint Phillips reporting, an incident that had occurred on the SAU Campus. Phillips told me he had responded to a shots fired call with injuries, reported in the Reynolds Center Parking Lot. Phillips told me he found two individuals had been shot with one of them deceased. I responded to the scene.

Also on scene was; SAU Police Chief Jeff Jester, Assistant Chief Brian Christenson along with Captain Michael Caldwell, Lt. Josh Miller and other officers of the Magnolia Police Department who had responded to the call. I was told and shown what had happen. Backseat passenger Alex Copeland, uninjured, told officers what had transpired. The driver of the small car, identified as Josh Smith (now deceased) had driven to the parking lot, meeting individuals in an apparent drug sale. Once at the parking lot, Smith was on the phone using the SnapChat application to communicate with the buyer. This unknown buyer was standing in the northern end of the parking lot and at one time told Smith, "I'm over here, see me waving?" which Smith did and drove to this point in the lot. Copeland, said the buyer got into the backseat drivers side of the car, inspected the marijuana for sale and then told Smith "I didn't bring my money because I was afraid you were going to rip me off, I just have to go get it." The buyer then gets out of the car and another individual runs up to the driver's window and starts shooting, striking Smith and front seat passenger Lucas Sharp. At this point, Smith places the car into reverse and speeds backwards, away from the shooter and buyer. The car struck a light standard, and stopped. Copeland exited the vehicle, running south in the lot toward the Brinson Art Building. Sharp also exited the vehicle, but was stumbling and walking due to his injuries, in the same direction as Copeland. Copeland called 911 reporting what happened. I inspected the scene and met with Capt. Caldwell. We reviewed what had happened and agreed he and his officers would collect evidence and process the crime scene. I would take Copeland to the University Police Department for further interview. Two other witnesses arrived at the scene and were told to meet me at the department offices. Chief Jester and Asst. Chief Christenson stayed on scene, with Christenson later coming to the office to begin the review of surveillance video.

Once at my office with Copeland, he told me the same basic story. He and Sharp agreed to ride with Smith to the sale. Copeland said Smith ask them to because he said he didn't really know this guy. Copeland told me Smith contacted and conducted the phone conversations with most buyers, by SnapChat, this one included. He said once they found the guy in the lot, the guy

got into the car, backseat driver's side. Copeland recalled, the guy was a black guy with dread type hair and some scruff on his face, wearing a dark hoodie and shorts. Copeland said this guy took the box of weed from Smith, looked at it, smelled it and gave it back to Smith. Copeland described the box as a plastic container with a lid that sealed by moving a lever. The guy then tells Smith he didn't bring the money because he was afraid he would get jumped, but he can go get it. Copeland tells me as soon as the guy got out, another guy runs up to the driver's window and starts shooting. Copeland said he thinks the guy shot three times then twice but is unsure. Copeland then tells me, when this guy starts shooting, Smith puts the car in reverse and speeds backward to get away, they hit something and spin around. He said when the car stops, he jumps out and starts running toward the Art building. Copeland said once across the road, he turns and sees Sharp coming behind him. He said he realizes Sharp had been hit and Smith is shot and in bad shape, and calls friends/roommates, telling them about the shooting and his belief that Smith maybe dead.

I was then made aware of two witnesses with information that had been instructed to come in. I found Tanner Bass and Sarah Sinclair waiting to speak with me. I spoke with both separately and both gave written statements prior to being interviewed. Both told me they were sitting in Sarah's car which was parked to the west of where the incident took place. They said they couldn't see the car but knew it parked near them from seeing it drive across the lot. They told me they were parked beside a large pickup truck and this truck blocked their view of the victim's car. What they did see was two individuals crouching beside a vehicle, behind them and in a row of vehicles to their north. Sarah saw them in the rearview mirror and commented, wondering as to what they were doing. Both described the individuals as black males wearing all black. They decided the individuals were playing tricks on friends and dismissed it. A short time later Sarah saw an individual walk past the rear of the car that startled her. While she and Tanner were discussing this, they heard a series of gunshots then the car that had pulled up, speed backwards hitting the light pole. Tanner told her "we need to get out of here!" Sarah drove south across the lot exiting at the light. Sarah said as they were leaving a white guy ran in front of her car, causing her to brake in avoiding hitting him. (Alex Copeland running from the scene) They both recounted driving around for a few minutes before returning to lot, to find law enforcement there. This was when they felt the need to tell what they saw.

I then went to the Magnolia Regional Medical Center and spoke with victim Lucas Sharp. Sharp was still being held in the Emergency Room section of the hospital, he was stable and had been admitted as a patient for overnight observation. Sharp said he didn't remember much, just that Josh asked he and Copeland to ride with him to the sale. He remembers Josh pulling into the lot, locating the guy he was to meet, parking, the guy inspecting the marijuana and then gunshots. Sharp said, Smith put the car in reverse trying to get away. Sharp said when he got out of the car he saw a small white car leaving the parking lot. He assumed the suspects were driving that car. (Tanner and Sarah were in her white ford focus, leaving the scene) Sharp said he didn't know the guy Smith was to meet and didn't really get a good look at him when he got into the car.

Assistant Chief of Police Christenson, began working on the review of cameras from various buildings, in an attempt to find suspect evidence and identification. Christenson found various views of the incident from a number of cameras. His search confirmed the sequence of events, as told by those involved and witnesses. He also found a vehicle suspected to be transporting the suspects. The vehicle was identified by make and model and narrowed to specific year by option packages within that particular model. A search of SAU's parking permit registration database from the year 2019/20 found only 3 vehicles of that make and model. One of those vehicles is owned/driven by Odies Wilson IV, a student at SAU. Wilson's physical appearance is similar to the description of one of the suspects. A search of the Magnolia area for a 2014 Dodge Avenger with black out package to include an all-black tire and rim combination, began.

Christenson found evidence on video of this vehicle in and around the area of the crime scene before and after the homicide. Christenson has video of this vehicle entering the Reynolds Center parking lot, circling through several times before Smith's arrival. On the vehicle's last trip through the lot it stopped for a short time near the area where Smith was directed to, then left to park in a dark area of the parking lot between NRRC and the Science building. The vehicle appeared to drop individuals off in the Reynolds lot. The suspect vehicle and Smith's vehicle met in passing as Smith entered the Reynolds lot, before the suspect vehicle parked in the NRRC/Science lot, on the north end.

Christenson further found on video, the images of Smith's car parking, what appears to be gunshot flashes and then Smith's vehicle suddenly reversing. Different cameras capture a number of angles of this event, to include Copeland and Sharp leaving the car and scene. Christenson also found video of three individuals running from the scene just after shots were fired. These individuals ran from the Reynolds lot scene, west to the area between the Science and Agriculture buildings. This is a direct access path to the NRRC/Science parking lot and the parked suspect vehicle. Christenson found video of individuals around the suspect vehicle shortly before it leaves, and within minutes after the Homicide. The timeline of events is consistent with the individuals running from the crime scene to the suspect vehicle and leaving. Christenson was able to follow the suspect vehicle as it left campus, turning west on West University Street. Lt. Miller of the Magnolia Police Department found video from the Dixie Mart located on the corner of West University and North Vine, that captures this suspect vehicle turning north on Vine street at a time consistent with travel from the SAU campus.

On 11/August/2020 Isiah Warren, a former SAU student, came to the UPD asking to speak to someone about the incident. Warren told me he and his girlfriend were in his car, parked to the west of the scene. He saw three individuals in the lot, on foot. Two were crouched hiding behind a parked truck and one was in the open talking on the phone. The one talking on the phone waived a small dark colored car over to him. (Smith's car) Warren said the lights came on in the car for a short time and then the two individuals crouched behind the truck, sprinted to the car and one began firing a gun. Warren said he thinks only one person had a gun. He said once the shots were fired, he was in disbelief of what he just witnessed. Warren told me the three individuals ran by in front of his car and toward and behind the Science/Agri buildings. Warren said he was very afraid and they left the parking lot. Warren could only give a general description of the three. Three black males, dressed in dark clothing. After hearing the news of

the events, Warren decided to come give his statement.

On 12/Aug/2020, Odies Wilson was asked to come to the University Police Department. It was explained to Wilson he was not under arrest or any obligation to comply. Wilson came to the office and was asked if he would answer a few questions about the Smith homicide. Wilson agreed. I explained to Wilson again he was not under arrest or detention and was free to leave at any time. I also explained when asking question of individual, or taking statements, I record the session by video and audio. Wilson agreed. I read him a statement of Miranda Rights and Wilson both verbally and by signature agreed he understood those rights. I asked him if he would speak to me about the incident and if so would he read and understand the waiver of rights clause. Wilson agreed verbally and by signature.

I asked Wilson if he knew Smith and he said he did but had only known him a short time. Wilson was asked if he knew of the events of yesterday. He said he heard of Josh getting shot. I asked him to explain, he said that he, Kam and Shakey had been in Magnolia until about 10:30 pm then they went to Little Rock by way of Prescott. They were at Kam's mom's house when he heard about it. Wilson told me he had bought marijuana from Smith only twice, but only small amounts. Once for him and once to hold for someone else. Wilson didn't seem surprised by what happened, telling me he had told Smith he had to be smart. When asked how that was, Wilson said he did it with an open window and no gun, not smart. Wilson told me he was from Little Rock and knows everybody needs a gun. Wilson also stated "he had a lot of stuff on him and no gun, I said you tell that to the wrong person, someone gonna take advantage of him." Wilson continued telling me he had told Smith about how he wasn't smart in how he did business. Wilson said he was at home when he saw about the shooting, then heard the name. Wilson said "I tried to tell him.....I don't know" Wilson continued saying he didn't know anything but if he (Smith) had any "amount" on him someone gonna take it. Wilson said he, Kam and Shakey came back to Magnolia around 5 pm on the 11th. He told me the purpose for the trip was to get some more of his things, bringing them to Magnolia.

Wilson was also questioned by SA Adam Pinner of the Arkansas State Police. Wilson told Pinner they left Magnolia about 10:30 or 11 and went to Little Rock. He told Pinner, they went by way of Prescott and stopped at the Pilot station before midnight. He also told of stopping in Arkadelphia at the Shell station, the first eastbound exit, around midnight for gas and food. Wilson also said he went to a girlfriend's house in Arkadelphia for a while. He told Pinner they arrived in Little Rock around 1 a.m. He told Pinner, his mom called him asking where he was. He told her he was in Little Rock and she told him about the incident. Wilson told Pinner this was about 3-4 a.m. and he was asleep at Kam's momma's house, in Little Rock.

I explained to Wilson a car matching his car had been seen at the crime scene. I asked if he would allow us to search his car. Wilson agreed, giving permission both verbally and by signature on a department Permission to Search form. Officers and Wilson went to his vehicle, a Black 2014 Dodge Avenger with black rims and tires that was parked in the Reynolds parking lot. Officers found two hoodies, one black and one dark grey and several pairs of gloves. These were taken as evidence to be submitted to the Arkansas State Crime Lab for analysis.

On 14/Aug/2020 I along with MPD Captain Michael Caldwell and ASP SA Adam Pinner interviewed Shakey Robinson. Robinson was named by Odie Wilson as a person in the car with him on the night of 11/Aug/2020. Robinson was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department.

Robinson told us, he, Odie Wilson, Le'Kameron (Kam) Tolbert and an unknown individual to him, were in Wilson's car (a Black 2014 Dodge Avenger with black rims and tires) on the night of the homicide. Robinson said they had been at Wilson's apartment (Fox Creek C1) playing games, dominos and Madden 2K. He explained they left the apartment on their way to Little Rock traveling to Kam's mother's house. Robinson told us he had a bad feeling about what was about to go down. He told us he dropped Wilson and Tolbert and the unknown guy off in the lot of Reynolds, before driving around back of and parking behind the Science building. He said he heard gunshots and a few minutes later they (Odie, Kam and unknown) came running back, around the backside of the building and got in the car, with him in the driver's seat. Robinson said he drove the car, out of the parking lot, turning right onto W. University, traveling west, then taking a right onto Vine Street. He said he drove straight, through the light at US 82 and on to Prescott, where they stopped at the Loves station. He said Odie drove the rest of the way to Little Rock. Stopping again in Arkadelphia twice and then finally arriving at Kam's mother's house in Little Rock. This was the final version of a number of scenarios, Robinson told us.

Also on this day we interviewed Odie Wilson. Again Wilson was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department. Wilson said the fourth person in the car was "Q" from Little Rock. Wilson said he didn't really know him. Wilson would not comment much about the incident, only saying ya'll know everything.

We also interviewed Le'Kameron Tolbert. Tolbert was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department. Kam said the group, he, Shakey, Odie, and "Q" were all in the car. Le'Kameron identified the unknown guy as "Q", a lifelong friend from Little Rock, who had come to Magnolia to help him move into the residence hall. Kam referred to "Q" as his brother. When questioned about the true relationship, Kam tried to distant "Q" as just a street guy from his neighborhood. He also said he was asleep and didn't see anything, but did wake up at one point and was alone in the car and it was parked behind the Science building on the SAU campus. Kam said he just went back to sleep, claiming he was very high at the time. He said Robinson drove them to Prescott and admitted to a photo being taken at the Loves station. He said Wilson drove from Prescott to Little Rock with two stops in Arkadelphia, one at a gas station and one to meet a girl.

Robinson finally admitted to us, the unknown guy and later identified only as "Q" is indeed Quincy Isiah Lewis DoB 11/24/2000. Lewis is also a blood relation to Le'Kameron Tolbert. Both Tolbert and Lewis share an address of 101519 Warren Drive, Little Rock AR 72209. These facts were corroborated by Briant Parker a friend of all involved.

Warren told me he and his girlfriend were in his car, parked to the west of the scene. He saw three individuals in the lot, on foot. Two were crouched hiding behind a parked truck and one was in the open talking on the phone. The one talking on the phone waived a small dark colored car over to him. (Smith's car) Warren said the lights came on in the car for a short time and then the two individuals crouched behind the truck, sprinted to the car and one began firing a gun. Warren said he thinks only one person had a gun. He said once the shots were fired, he was in disbelief of what he just witnessed. Warren told me the three individuals ran by in front of his car and toward and behind the Science/Agri buildings. Warren said he was very afraid and they left the parking lot. Warren could only give a general description of the three. Three black males, dressed in dark clothing. After hearing the news of

the events, Warren decided to come give his statement.

On 12/Aug 2020, Odies Wilson was asked to come to the University Police Department. It was explained to Wilson he was not under arrest or any obligation to comply. Wilson came to the office and was asked if he would answer a few questions about the Smith homicide. Wilson agreed. I explained to Wilson again he was not under arrest or detention and was free to leave at any time. I also explained when asking question of individual, or taking statements, I record the session by video and audio. Wilson agreed. I read him a statement of Miranda Rights and Wilson both verbally and by signature agreed he understood those rights. I asked him if he would speak to me about the incident and if so would he read and understand the waiver of rights clause. Wilson agreed verbally and by signature.

I asked Wilson if he knew Smith and he said he did but had only known him a short time. Wilson was asked if he knew of the events of yesterday. He said he heard of Josh getting shot. I asked him to explain, he said that he, Kam and Shakey had been in Magnolia until about 10:30 pm then they went to Little Rock by way of Prescott. They were at Kam's mom's house when he heard about it. Wilson told me he had bought marijuana from Smith only twice, but only small amounts. Once for him and once to hold for someone else. Wilson didn't seem surprised by what happened, telling me he had told Smith he had to be smart. When asked how that was, Wilson said he did it with an open window and no gun, not smart. Wilson told me he was from Little Rock and knows everybody needs a gun. Wilson also stated "he had a lot of stuff on him and no gun, I said you tell that to the wrong person, someone gonna take advantage of him." Wilson continued telling me he had told Smith about how he wasn't smart in how he did business. Wilson said he was at home when he saw about the shooting, then heard the name. Wilson said "I tried to tell him....I don't know" Wilson continued saying he didn't know anything but if he (Smith) had any "amount" on him someone gonna take it. Wilson said he, Kam and Shakey came back to Magnolia around 5 pm on the 11th. He told me the purpose for the trip was to get some more of his things, bringing them to Magnolia.

Wilson was also questioned by SA Adam Pinner of the Arkansas State Police. Wilson told Pinner they left Magnolia about 10:30 or 11 and went to Little Rock. He told Pinner, they went by way of Prescott and stopped at the Pilot station before midnight. He also told of stopping in Arkadelphia at the Shell station, the first eastbound exit, around midnight for gas and food. Wilson also said he went to a girlfriend's house in Arkadelphia for a while. He told Pinner they arrived in Little Rock around 1 a.m. He told Pinner, his mom called him asking where he was. He told her he was in Little Rock and she told him about the incident. Wilson told Pinner this was about 3-4 a.m. and he was asleep at Kam's momma's house, in Little Rock.

I explained to Wilson a car matching his car had been seen at the crime scene. I asked if he would allow us to search his car. Wilson agreed, giving permission both verbally and by signature on a department Permission to Search form. Officers and Wilson went to his vehicle, a Black 2014 Dodge Avenger with black rims and tires that was parked in the Reynolds parking lot. Officers found two hoodies, one black and one dark grey and several pairs of gloves. These were taken as evidence to be submitted to the Arkansas State Crime Lab for analysis.

On 14/Aug/2020 I along with MPD Captain Michael Caldwell and ASP SA Adam Pinner interviewed Shakey Robinson. Robinson was named by Odie Wilson as a person in the car with him on the night of 11/Aug/2020. Robinson was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department.

Robinson told us, he, Odie Wilson, Le'Kameron (Kam) Tolbert and an unknown individual to him, were in Wilson's car (a Black 2014 Dodge Avenger with black rims and tires) on the night of the homicide. Robinson said they had been at Wilson's apartment (Fox Creek C1) playing **games, dominos and Madden 2K**. He explained they left the apartment on their way to Little Rock traveling to Kam's mother's house. Robinson told us he had a bad feeling about what was about to go down. He told us he dropped Wilson and Tolbert and the unknown guy off in the lot of Reynolds, before driving around back of and parking behind the Science building. He said he heard gunshots and a few minutes later they (Odie, Kam and unknown) came running back, around the backside of the building and got in the car, with him in the driver's seat. Robinson said he drove the car, out of the parking lot, turning right onto W. University, traveling west, then taking a right onto Vine Street. He said he drove straight, through the light at US 82 and on to Prescott, where they stopped at the Loves station. He said Odie drove the rest of the way to Little Rock. Stopping again in Arkadelphia twice and then finally arriving at Kam's mother's house in Little Rock. This was the final version of a number of scenarios, Robinson told us.


Also on this day we interviewed Odie Wilson. Again Wilson was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department. Wilson said the fourth person in the car was "Q" from Little Rock. Wilson said he didn't really know him. Wilson would not comment much about the incident, only saying ya'll know everything.

We also interviewed Le'Kameron Tolbert. Tolbert was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department. Kam said the group, he, Shakey, Odie, and "Q" were all in the car. Le'Kameron identified the unknown guy as "Q", a lifelong friend from Little Rock, who had come to Magnolia to help him move into the residence hall. Kam referred to "Q" as his brother. When questioned about the true relationship, Kam tried to distant "Q" as just a street guy from his neighborhood. He also said he was asleep and didn't see anything, but did wake up at one point and was alone in the car and it was parked behind the Science building on the SAU campus. Kam said he just went back to sleep, claiming he was very high at the time. He said Robinson drove them to Prescott and admitted to a photo being taken at the Loves station. He said Wilson drove from Prescott to Little Rock with two stops in Arkadelphia, one at a gas station and one to meet a girl.

Robinson finally admitted to us, the unknown guy and later identified only as "Q" is indeed Quincy Isiah Lewis DoB 11/24/2000. Lewis is also a blood relation to Le'Kameron Tolbert. Both Tolbert and Lewis share an address of 101519 Warren Drive, Little Rock AR 72209. These facts were corroborated by Briant Parker a friend of all involved.



Phillips told me he had responded to a shots fired call with injuries, reported in the Reynolds Center Parking Lot. Phillips told me he found two individuals had been shot with one of them deceased. I responded to the scene.

Also on scene was; SAU Police Chief Jeff Jester, Assistant Chief Brian Christenson along with Captain Michael Caldwell, Lt. Josh Miller and other officers of the Magnolia Police Department who had responded to the call. I was told and shown what had happen. Backseat passenger Alex Copeland, uninjured, told officers what had transpired. The driver of the small car, identified as Josh Smith (now deceased) had driven to the parking lot, meeting individuals in an apparent drug sale. Once at the parking lot, Smith was on the phone using the SnapChat application to communicate with the buyer. This unknown buyer was standing in the northern end of the parking lot and at one time told Smith, "I'm over here, see me waving?" which Smith did and drove to this point in the lot. Copeland, said the buyer got into the backseat drivers side of the car, inspected the marijuana for sale and then told Smith "I didn't bring my money because I was afraid you were going to rip me off, I just have to go get it." The buyer then gets out of the car and another individual runs up to the driver's window and starts shooting, striking Smith and front seat passenger Lucas Sharp. At this point, Smith places the car into reverse and speeds backwards, away from the shooter and buyer. The car struck a light standard, and stopped. Copeland exited the vehicle, running south in the lot toward the Brinson Art Building. Sharp also exited the vehicle, but was stumbling and walking due to his injuries, in the same direction as Copeland. Copeland called 911 reporting what happened. I inspected the scene and met with Capt. Caldwell. We reviewed what had happened and agreed he and his officers would collect evidence and process the crime scene. I would take Copeland to the University Police Department for further interview. Two other witnesses arrived at the scene and were told to meet me at the department offices. Chief Jester and Asst. Chief Christenson stayed on scene, with Christenson later coming to the office to begin the review of surveillance video.

Once at my office with Copeland, he told me the same basic story. He and Sharp agreed to ride with Smith to the sale. Copeland said Smith ask them to because he said he didn't really know this guy. Copeland told me Smith contacted and conducted the phone conversations with most buyers, by SnapChat, this one included. He said once they found the guy in the lot, the guy

got into the car, backseat driver's side. Copeland recalled, the guy was a black guy with dread type hair and some scruff on his face, wearing a dark hoodie and shorts. Copeland said this guy took the box of weed from Smith, looked at it, smelled it and gave it back to Smith. Copeland described the box as a plastic container with a lid that sealed by moving a lever. The guy then tells Smith he didn't bring the money because he was afraid he would get jumped, but he can go get it. Copeland tells me as soon as the guy got out, another guy runs up to the driver's window and starts shooting. Copeland said he thinks the guy shot three times then twice but is unsure. They said they couldn't see the car but knew it parked near them from seeing it drive across the lot. They told me they were parked beside a large pickup truck and this truck blocked their view of the victim's car. What they did see was two individuals crouching beside a vehicle, behind them and in a row of vehicles to their north. Sarah saw them in the rearview mirror and commented, wondering as to what they were doing. Both described the individuals as black males wearing all black. They decided the individuals were playing tricks on friends and dismissed it. A short time later Sarah saw an individual walk past the rear of the car that startled her. While she and Tanner were discussing this, they heard a series of gunshots then the car that had pulled up, speed backwards hitting the light pole. Tanner told her "we need to get out of here!" Sarah drove south across the lot exiting at the light. Sarah said as they were leaving a white guy ran in front of her car, causing her to brake in avoiding hitting him. (Alex Copeland running from the scene) They both recounted driving around for a few minutes before returning to lot, to find law enforcement there. This was when they felt the need to tell what they saw.

I then went to the Magnolia Regional Medical Center and spoke with victim Lucas Sharp. Sharp was still being held in the Emergency Room section of the hospital, he was stable and had been admitted as a patient for overnight observation. Sharp said he didn't remember much, just that Josh asked he and Copeland to ride with him to the sale. He remembers Josh pulling into the lot, locating the guy he was to meet, parking, the guy inspecting the marijuana and then gunshots. Sharp said, Smith put the car in reverse trying to get away. Sharp said when he got out of the car he saw a small white car leaving the parking lot. He assumed the suspects were driving that car. (Tanner and Sarah were in her white ford focus, leaving the scene) Sharp said he didn't know the guy Smith was to meet and didn't really get a good look at him when he got into the car.

Assistant Chief of Police Christenson, began working on the review of cameras from various buildings, in an attempt to find suspect evidence and identification. Christenson found various views of the incident from a number of cameras. His search confirmed the sequence of events, as told by those involved and witnesses. He also found a vehicle suspected to be transporting the suspects. The vehicle was identified by make and model and narrowed to specific year by option packages within that particular model. A search of SAU's parking permit registration database from the year 2019/20 found only 3 vehicles of that make and model. One of those vehicles is owned/driven by Odies Wilson IV, a student at SAU. Wilson's physical appearance is similar to the description of one of the suspects. A search of the Magnolia area for a 2014 Dodge Avenger with black out package to include an all-black tire and rim combination, began.

Christenson found evidence on video of this vehicle in and around the area of the crime scene before and after the homicide. Christenson has video of this vehicle entering the Reynolds Center parking lot, circling through several times before Smith's arrival. On the vehicle's last trip through the lot it stopped for a short time near the area where Smith was directed to, then left to park in a dark area of the parking lot between NRRC and the Science building. The vehicle appeared to drop individuals off in the Reynolds lot. The suspect vehicle and Smith's vehicle met in passing as Smith entered the Reynolds lot, before the suspect vehicle parked in the NRRC/Science lot, on the north end.

Christenson further found on video, the images of Smith's car parking, what appears to be gunshot flashes and then Smith's vehicle suddenly reversing. Different cameras capture a number of angles of this event, to include Copeland and Sharp leaving the car and scene. 

Also on scene was; SAU Police Chief Jeff Jester, Assistant Chief Brian Christenson along with Captain Michael Caldwell, Lt. Josh Miller and other officers of the Magnolia Police Department who had responded to the call. I was told and shown what had happen. Backseat passenger Alex Copeland, uninjured, told officers what had transpired. The driver of the small car, identified as Josh Smith (now deceased) had driven to the parking lot, meeting individuals in an apparent drug sale. Once at the parking lot, Smith was on the phone using the SnapChat application to communicate with the buyer. This unknown buyer was standing in the northern end of the parking lot and at one time told Smith, "I'm over here, see me waving?" which Smith did and drove to this point in the lot. Copeland, said the buyer got into the backseat drivers side of the car, inspected the marijuana for sale and then told Smith "I didn't bring my money because I was afraid you were going to rip me off, I just have to go get it." The buyer then gets out of the car and another individual runs up to the driver's window and starts shooting, striking Smith and front seat passenger Lucas Sharp. At this point, Smith places the car into reverse and speeds backwards, away from the shooter and buyer. The car struck a light standard, and stopped. Copeland exited the vehicle, running south in the lot toward the Brinson Art Building. Sharp also exited the vehicle, but was stumbling and walking due to his injuries, in the same direction as Copeland. Copeland called 911 reporting what happened. I inspected the scene and met with Capt. Caldwell. We reviewed what had happened and agreed he and his officers would collect evidence and process the crime scene. I would take Copeland to the University Police Department for further interview. Two other witnesses arrived at the scene and were told to meet me at the department offices. Chief Jester and Asst. Chief Christenson stayed on scene, with Christenson later coming to the office to begin the review of surveillance video.

Once at my office with Copeland, he told me the same basic story. He and Sharp agreed to ride with Smith to the sale. Copeland said Smith ask them to because he said he didn't really know this guy. Copeland told me Smith contacted and conducted the phone conversations with most buyers, by SnapChat, this one included. He said once they found the guy in the lot, the guy

got into the car, backseat driver's side. Copeland recalled, the guy was a black guy with dread type hair and some scruff on his face, wearing a dark hoodie and shorts. Copeland said this guy took the box of weed from Smith, looked at it, smelled it and gave it back to Smith. Copeland described the box as a plastic container with a lid that sealed by moving a lever. The guy then tells Smith he didn't bring the money because he was afraid he would get jumped, but he can go get it. Copeland tells me as soon as the guy got out, another guy runs up to the driver's window and starts shooting. Copeland said he thinks the guy shot three times then twice but is unsure. Copeland then tells me, when this guy starts shooting, Smith puts the car in reverse and speeds backward to get away, they hit something and spin around. He said when the car stops, he jumps out and starts running toward the Art building. Copeland said once across the road, he turns and sees Sharp coming behind him. He said he realizes Sharp had been hit and Smith is shot and in bad shape, and calls friends/roommates, telling them about the shooting and his belief that Smith maybe dead.

I was then made aware of two witnesses with information that had been instructed to come in. I found Tanner Bass and Sarah Sinclair waiting to speak with me. I spoke with both separately and both gave written statements prior to being interviewed. Both told me they were sitting in Sarah's car which was parked to the west of where the incident took place. They said they couldn't see the car but knew it parked near them from seeing it drive across the lot. They told me they were parked beside a large pickup truck and this truck blocked their view of the victim's car. What they did see was two individuals crouching beside a vehicle, behind them and in a row of vehicles to their north. Sarah saw them in the rearview mirror and commented, wondering as to what they were doing. Both described the individuals as black males wearing all black. They decided the individuals were playing tricks on friends and dismissed it. A short time later Sarah saw an individual walk past the rear of the car that startled her. While she and Tanner were discussing this, they heard a series of gunshots then the car that had pulled up, speed backwards hitting the light pole. Tanner told her "we need to get out of here!" Sarah drove south across the lot exiting at the light. Sarah said as they were leaving a white guy ran in front of her car, causing her to brake in avoiding hitting him. (Alex Copeland running from the scene) They both recounted driving around for a few minutes before returning to lot, to find law enforcement there. This was when they felt the need to tell what they saw.

I then went to the Magnolia Regional Medical Center and spoke with victim Lucas Sharp. Sharp was still being held in the Emergency Room section of the hospital, he was stable and had been admitted as a patient for overnight observation. Sharp said he didn't remember much, just that Josh asked he and Copeland to ride with him to the sale. He remembers Josh pulling into the lot, locating the guy he was to meet, parking, the guy inspecting the marijuana and then gunshots. Sharp said, Smith put the car in reverse trying to get away. Sharp said when he got out of the car he saw a small white car leaving the parking lot. He assumed the suspects were driving that car. (Tanner and Sarah were in her white ford focus, leaving the scene) Sharp said he didn't know the guy Smith was to meet and didn't really get a good look at him when he got into the car.

Assistant Chief of Police Christenson, began working on the review of cameras from various buildings, in an attempt to find suspect evidence and identification. Christenson found various views of the incident from a number of cameras. His search confirmed the sequence of events, as told by those involved and witnesses. He also found a vehicle suspected to be transporting the suspects. The vehicle was identified by make and model and narrowed to specific year by option packages within that particular model. A search of SAU's parking permit registration database from the year 2019/20 found only 3 vehicles of that make and model. One of those vehicles is owned/driven by Odies Wilson IV, a student at SAU. Wilson's physical appearance is similar to the description of one of the suspects. A search of the Magnolia area for a 2014 Dodge Avenger with black out package to include an all-black tire and rim combination, began.

Christenson found evidence on video of this vehicle in and around the area of the crime scene before and after the homicide. Christenson has video of this vehicle entering the Reynolds Center parking lot, circling through several times before Smith's arrival. On the vehicle's last trip through the lot it stopped for a short time near the area where Smith was directed to, then left to park in a dark area of the parking lot between NRRC and the Science building. The vehicle appeared to drop individuals off in the Reynolds lot. The suspect vehicle and Smith's vehicle met in passing as Smith entered the Reynolds lot, before the suspect vehicle parked in the NRRC/Science lot, on the north end.

Christenson further found on video, the images of Smith's car parking, what appears to be gunshot flashes and then Smith's vehicle suddenly reversing. Different cameras capture a number of angles of this event, to include Copeland and Sharp leaving the car and scene. Christenson also found video of three individuals running from the scene just after shots were fired. These individuals ran from the Reynolds lot scene, west to the area between the Science and Agriculture buildings. This is a direct access path to the NRRC/Science parking lot and the parked suspect vehicle. Christenson found video of individuals around the suspect vehicle shortly before it leaves, and within minutes after the Homicide. The timeline of events is consistent with the individuals running from the crime scene to the suspect vehicle and leaving. Christenson was able to follow the suspect vehicle as it left campus, turning west on West University Street. Lt. Miller of the Magnolia Police Department found video from the Dixie Mart located on the corner of West University and North Vine, that captures this suspect vehicle turning north on Vine street at a time consistent with travel from the SAU campus.

On 11/August 2020 Isiah Warren, a former SAU student, came to the UPD asking to speak to someone about the incident. Warren told me he and his girlfriend were in his car, parked to the west of the scene. He saw three individuals in the lot, on foot. Two were crouched hiding behind a parked truck and one was in the open talking on the phone. The one talking on the phone waived a small dark colored car over to him. (Smith's car) Warren said the lights came on in the car for a short time and then the two individuals crouched behind the truck, sprinted to the car and one began firing a gun. Warren said he thinks only one person had a gun. He said once the shots were fired, he was in disbelief of what he just witnessed. Warren told me the three individuals ran by in front of his car and toward and behind the Science/Agri buildings. Warren said he was very afraid and they left the parking lot. Warren could only give a general description of the three. Three black males, dressed in dark clothing. After hearing the news of

the events, Warren decided to come give his statement.

On 12/Aug/2020, Odies Wilson was asked to come to the University Police Department. It was explained to Wilson he was not under arrest or any obligation to comply. Wilson came to the office and was asked if he would answer a few questions about the Smith homicide. Wilson agreed. I explained to Wilson again he was not under arrest or detention and was free to leave at any time. I also explained when asking question of individual, or taking statements, I record the session by video and audio. Wilson agreed. I read him a statement of Miranda Rights and Wilson both verbally and by signature agreed he understood those rights. I asked him if he would speak to me about the incident and if so would he read and understand the waiver of rights clause. Wilson agreed verbally and by signature.

I asked Wilson if he knew Smith and he said he did but had only known him a short time. Wilson was asked if he knew of the events of yesterday. He said he heard of Josh getting shot. I asked him to explain. he said that he, Kam and Shakey had been in Magnolia until about 10:30 pm then they went to Little Rock by way of Prescott. They were at Kam's mom's house when he heard about it. Wilson told me he had bought marijuana from Smith only twice, but only small amounts. Once for him and once to hold for someone else. Wilson didn't seem surprised by what happened, telling me he had told Smith he had to be smart. When asked how that was, Wilson said he did it with an open window and no gun, not smart. Wilson told me he was from Little Rock and knows everybody needs a gun. Wilson also stated "he had a lot of stuff on him and no gun, I said you tell that to the wrong person, someone gonna take advantage of him." Wilson continued telling me he had told Smith about how he wasn't smart in how he did business. Wilson said he was at home when he saw about the shooting, then heard the name. Wilson said "I tried to tell him....I don't know" Wilson continued saying he didn't know anything but if he (Smith) had any "amount" on him someone gonna take it. Wilson said he, Kam and Shakey came back to Magnolia around 5 pm on the 11th. He told me the purpose for the trip was to get some more of his things, bringing them to Magnolia.

Wilson was also questioned by SA Adam Pinner of the Arkansas State Police. Wilson told Pinner they left Magnolia about 10:30 or 11 and went to Little Rock. He told Pinner, they went by way of Prescott and stopped at the Pilot station before midnight. He also told of stopping in Arkadelphia at the Shell station, the first eastbound exit, around midnight for gas and food. Wilson also said he went to a girlfriend's house in Arkadelphia for a while. He told Pinner they arrived in Little Rock around 1 a.m. He told Pinner, his mom called him asking where he was. He told her he was in Little Rock and she told him about the incident. Wilson told Pinner this was about 3-4 a.m. and he was asleep at Kam's momma's house, in Little Rock.

I explained to Wilson a car matching his car had been seen at the crime scene. I asked if he would allow us to search his car. Wilson agreed, giving permission both verbally and by signature on a department Permission to Search form. Officers and Wilson went to his vehicle, a Black 2014 Dodge Avenger with black rims and tires that was parked in the Reynolds parking lot. Officers found two hoodies, one black and one dark grey and several pairs of gloves. These were taken as evidence to be submitted to the Arkansas State Crime Lab for analysis.

On 14/Aug/2020 I along with MPD Captain Michael Caldwell and ASP SA Adam Pinner interviewed Shakey Robinson. Robinson was named by Odie Wilson as a person in the car with him on the night of 11/Aug/2020. Robinson was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department.

Robinson told us, he, Odie Wilson, Le'Kameron (Kam) Tolbert and an unknown individual to him, were in Wilson's car (a Black 2014 Dodge Avenger with black rims and tires) on the night of the homicide. Robinson said they had been at Wilson's apartment (Fox Creek C1) playing games, dominos and Madden 2K. He explained they left the apartment on their way to Little Rock traveling to Kam's mother's house. Robinson told us he had a bad feeling about what was about to go down. He told us he dropped Wilson and Tolbert and the unknown guy off in the lot of Reynolds, before driving around back of and parking behind the Science building. He said he heard gunshots and a few minutes later they (Odie, Kam and unknown) came running back, around the backside of the building and got in the car, with him in the driver's seat. Robinson said he drove the car, out of the parking lot, turning right onto W. University, traveling west, then taking a right onto Vine Street. He said he drove straight, through the light at US 82 and on to Prescott, where they stopped at the Loves station. He said Odie drove the rest of the way to Little Rock. Stopping again in Arkadelphia twice and then finally arriving at Kam's mother's house in Little Rock. This was the final version of a number of scenarios, Robinson told us.

Also on this day we interviewed Odie Wilson. Again Wilson was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department. Wilson said the fourth person in the car was "Q" from Little Rock. Wilson said he didn't really know him. Wilson would not comment much about the incident, only saying ya'll know everything.

We also interviewed Le'Kameron Tolbert. Tolbert was read his Miranda rights and acknowledged he understood them both verbally and by signature of the rights form. The interview was recorded by video and audio and conducted at the SAU police department. Kam said the group, he, Shakey, Odie, and "Q" were all in the car. Le'Kameron identified the unknown guy as "Q", a lifelong friend from Little Rock, who had come to Magnolia to help him move into the residence hall. Kam referred to "Q" as his brother. When questioned about the true relationship, Kam tried to distant "Q" as just a street guy from his neighborhood. He also said he was asleep and didn't see anything, but did wake up at one point and was alone in the car and it was parked behind the Science building on the SAU campus. Kam said he just went back to sleep, claiming he was very high at the time. He said Robinson drove them to Prescott and admitted to a photo being taken at the Loves station. He said Wilson drove from Prescott to Little Rock with two stops in Arkadelphia, one at a gas station and one to meet a girl.

Robinson finally admitted to us, the unknown guy and later identified only as "Q" is indeed Quincy Isiah Lewis DoB 11/24/2000. Lewis is also a blood relation to Le'Kameron Tolbert. Both Tolbert and Lewis share an address of 101519 Warren Drive, Little Rock AR 72209. These facts were corroborated by Briant Parker a friend of all involved.
