Over the last three years, I made myself several personal promises that would have to be fulfilled by the Board and staff before I could leave. This list is not all-inclusive.

Board Successes:

- Create transparency for the public and all election activities.
- Ensure unrestricted access is to all Board members.
- Provide processes, necessary tools, and communications to Board members.
- Create standardized templates for policies and employ their use.
- Install cameras in areas where ballots are processed.
- Communicate needs effectively with staff and "hire" a new Director.
- Restore previously abandoned effective processes.
- Improve overall security and ensure ballot secrecy.
- Complete ten year redistricting of county quorum districts without interference.
- Utilize social media to educate voters on upcoming elections and related dates.
- IP establish a secure area with limited access for voted ballots during an election, monitored by cameras with logs for audit, and chain of custody.
